- Use familiar websites

Do not use search engines to buy your things, use sites other people have used and know they are legit.

For example, we all know Amazon.com and that it carries everything under the sun; likewise, just about every major retail outlet has an online store, from Target to Best Buy to Home Depot.

Check the site reviews as well. This is a very important aspect when choosing a place to buy. If you do not know it, check the reviews, they will tell you if you can trust them or not.

- Look for the lock

Never enter your credit card details in a website that does not have the SSL (Secure Sockets Layer) encryption installed—at the very least. You'll know if the site has SSL because the URL for the site will start with HTTPS:// (instead of just HTTP://). An icon of a locked padlock will appear.

- Don't tell all

Online shoppers do not need to know everything. They do not need your Social Security Number or your birthday. Do not give too much information. They might steal your identity.



- Check bank statements

Do not wait for your bank statement to come at the end of the month. Check it regularly. This might help you discover if some extra charges have been made.

- Use strong passwords

In your computer, always choose passwords that are not easy to guess by others. Use long and strong passwords. Do not use your name or your date of birth, as anybody can guess that.

- Avoid public terminals

Do not enter your credit card or account details in public places. These can have viruses or softwares that will steal your information. Do it only from safe places.

- Know what's too good to be true

Some promotions and offers are too good to be true. Think wisely! If it's too good to be true, it's probably a scam.



2. ONSITE PURCHASES

Onsite purchases are purchases you make when you are at the store. You get to try on your clothes or see the articles you want to buy and choose from others right on the spot. No waiting needed.

For this kind of purchase, you only need to be careful to keep your wallet in a safe place, as everything is more secure.
